Privacy Notice Use of CCTV

SQLI Nordics AB ("**SQLI**") considers that the protection of your personal data and the respect of your privacy are key issues to which it intends to pay particular attention.

Accordingly, this privacy policy (hereinafter the "**Policy**") is intended to inform you about the processing of your personal data in connection with the video surveillance systems installed on our premises ("**you**" or the "**Data Subject(s)**").

SQLI Nordics AB, whose registered office is located at Kyrkogatan 26, 411 15 Gothenburg, registered under the number 556646-1876, is responsible for processing your personal data (hereinafter "**we**", "**us**", "**our**").

1 What personal data do we collect?

The collection of your personal data is mandatory, without which we will not be able to ensure the surveillance of our premises for the purposes listed below.

Such data will only be processed to the extent legally permitted and necessary to the exclusion of any other incompatible purpose. Specific measures will be taken to ensure that the processing of such data remains limited to the strict minimum.

2 Why do we use your personal data?

In any event, please note that we will not process your personal data for any other purposes that are incompatible with those mentioned above.

All video surveillance cameras installed on our premises have been positioned to film only those areas that need to be monitored in order to achieve the purposes set out above, without disproportionate intrusion on your privacy. In particular, the cameras are not used for employee surveillance or to monitor working hours.

We have posted signs near the areas covered by each of our video surveillance cameras, so that you are immediately informed when you enter an area covered by video surveillance.

3 With whom do we share your personal data?

As part of our processing operations, we may communicate your personal data to authorized members of our staff and to the following recipients:

- if SQLI uses a subcontractor to manage and/or maintain its video surveillance systems, the service provider responsible for managing the video surveillance systems installed on our premises on our behalf.
- competent courts, law enforcement agencies, public authorities, government agencies and public entities, where applicable (in particular in the event of an incident or offence detected by our video surveillance systems).

Regardless of the recipient, we will only disclose your personal data on a strictly need-to-know basis and only to the extent required to achieve the purposes identified in this Policy.

We do not sell your personal data.

4 Do we transfer data outside the European Economic Area (EEA)?

We do not transfer your personal data outside the European Economic Area.

5 How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep your personal data for no longer than is necessary for the purposes of the processing concerned.

Images recorded by our video surveillance systems are kept for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of recording.

By way of exception, personal data may be kept for a longer period, for the sole purpose of fulfilling the following purposes:

- compliance with our legal obligations; and
- verifications required in the event of an incident to establish, exercise, or defend our rights, particularly in the context of disciplinary or criminal proceedings.

In any event, once the applicable retention period has expired, we will irrevocably delete or anonymize your personal data so that you can no longer be identified.

6 What rights do you have?

In accordance with applicable data protection regulations, and most specifically the GDPR, you have the following rights: right of access, rectification, erasure, opposition, limitation of processing, portability of your personal data.

Where the processing of your personal data is based on your consent, you may withdraw it at any time.

- [Right of access](#)

You may request access to your personal data at any time. If you exercise your right of access, we will send you a copy of the data in our possession, together with all the information relating to its processing.

- [Right to rectification](#)

You have the right to ask us to rectify or complete any inaccurate or incomplete personal data in our possession.

- [Right to erasure](#)

You have the right to ask us to delete your personal data, for example if it is no longer required for processing.

We will do our best to comply with your request. Please note, however, that we may be obliged to retain all or part of your personal data if we are required to do so by law or if such data is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defense of our legal rights.

- [Right to object](#)

You may object at any time, for reasons relating to your situation, to our using your personal data. We will then cease processing your personal data unless there are compelling legitimate grounds for us to continue processing your personal data (for example, if your data is necessary to establish, exercise or defend our rights or the rights of third parties in a court of law). If we are unable to comply with your objection, we will inform you of the reasons for our refusal.

- [Right to restrict processing](#)

You may also request that we restrict the processing of your personal data for reasons relating to your situation. For example, if you dispute the accuracy of your personal data or object to its processing, you may also request that we do not process your data for the time necessary to verify and investigate your claims.

In this case, we will temporarily refrain from processing your personal data until the necessary verifications have been carried out or until we comply with your requests.

- [Right to data portability](#)

You may request the portability of your personal data. If you so request, we will provide you with your personal data in a readable and structured format that enables you to re-use it easily.

We would like to draw your attention to the fact that the portability of your personal data applies only to the personal data that you have communicated to us, provided that the communication of your personal data does not infringe the rights of third parties. If we are unable to comply with your request, we will inform you of the reasons for our refusal.

- [Right to withdraw your consent](#)

Where the processing of your personal data is based on your consent, you may withdraw it at any time. Withdrawal of your consent prevents us from processing your personal data but does not affect the lawfulness of any processing carried out prior to such withdrawal.

7 How to exercise these rights

To exercise your rights, please contact our dedicated department using the contact details given in Section 9 (How can you contact us?). To process your request as efficiently as possible, we may ask you for certain additional information to confirm your identity and/or facilitate the location of the personal data concerned by your request.

Please note that some of these rights are subject to specific conditions dictated by the applicable regulations on the protection of personal data. If your situation does not meet these conditions, we will unfortunately be unable to process your request. We will inform you of the reasons for our refusal.

In any event, if you consider that your rights have not been respected or that your personal data has been processed in breach of the applicable regulations on the protection of personal data and the principles set out in this Policy, you may file a complaint with the competent courts or with the competent data protection authority, in Sweden, the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection, Integritetsskyddsmyndigheten, Box 8114, 104 20 Stockholm, Sweden .
